Instructions and Submission Information

jemFEST 2023 will take place Saturday November 18, 2023 at the University of North Florida in Jacksonville.

The featured performer is Grammy-award winning cellist <u>Nick Photinos</u>. We invite submissions of compositions for cello and electronics (live or fixed; up to 4.1). In particular, Nick is looking for compositions that are circa 10 minutes or less and can be performed (or recreated) using Ableton Live, Nick's preferred DAW.

The submission deadline is August 15, 2023 at Midnight (EDT).

There is no theme for this year's festival. We encourage composers of all electroacoustic styles to apply – fixed media and live electronics are both welcome.

To submit, please email links to recordings and scores (if applicable) for your compositions to <u>jemfestmusic@gmail.com</u>. Make sure links do not require a password of any kind.

Your emailed submission should also include the following information:

To maintain anonymity for our adjudication committee, please remove any identifying information from all files before sending.

Festival Presentation Format

If your composition is accepted, you will be asked (but not required) to attend the festival at the University of North Florida (Jacksonville). Those who can attend the event will be given priority. Travel or housing funding is unfortunately not available.

There is no application or registration fee.
